Astronaut Training Officer Description:

As an astronaut training officer, you will design and implement comprehensive training programs tailored to the physical, technical and psychological needs of the selected astronauts. You will also coordinate with the astronaut team heads and other the heads / VP's of other teams in the organisation to ensure the training aligns with mission goals and requirements. Applicants must have strong communication skills and demonstrate initiative in order to thrive in this role.

- **Average hours required per week** - 4-8 hours
- **Tasks and Responsibilities:**
 - Work with the heads of the astronaut team to develop a comprehensive training regiment for the astronauts.

- Organize and conduct training simulations, including emergency scenarios, extravehicular activities (EVA), and team-building exercises.
- Monitor and assess the progress of trainees, providing continuous feedback to optimize performance and address weaknesses.
- Collaborate with external experts and institutions to deliver specialized training (e.g., medical, engineering, or spaceflight operations).
- Ensure the physical and psychological well-being of the trainees throughout the training period, making adjustments as needed.
- Suggest improvements for future training cycles based on feedback and performance metrics from previous missions.
